for newcomers in the industry. "The answer is always on the page or with the director," she advises.

Reread your script if you're stuck or have another read-through with the director." She emphasizes the importance of perseverance and continuous learning, urging professionals to keep going even after setbacks. "Don't be afraid to admit you don't

know something ever, and learn it then," she adds.

Suzie continues to push boundaries and inspire with her work. From her beginnings in Ireland to her success on the international stage, she remains grounded in her passion for storytelling through the lens of a camera. "I just feel like I got the best job in the world," she says with a smile. "I love it, you know? And I feel really lucky to be here basically." With each project, she leaves an indelible mark on the world of cinematography, reminding us of the power of visual storytelling to move and inspire.



Suzie Lavelle's journey into cinematography began unexpectedly during her travels, armed with a Pentax camera. Capturing the world around her ignited her passion for photography, leading her to enrol I in a photography course. Encouraged by a teacher, she while in college, delving into the camera department and never looking back.

Starting from scratch, Suzie worked tirelessly on short films with friends, exploring various roles within the camera department. One of these films caught attention, opening doors to prestigious opportunities like studying at the

National Film and Television School in the UK. At NFTS, Suzie's passion flourished under experienced mentors, immersing herself in the art and science of visual storytelling.

Inspired by mentors like Noski Deville, Suzie's career blossomed with projects funded by the Irish Film Board and collaborations with acclaimed directors like Connor Horgan. Together, they pushed boundaries, creating films known for bold storytelling and unconventional shooting styles.

From independent films to high-profile projects like "Doctor Who," she continued to defy expectations, earning accolades for her work.



For Suzie Lavelle, BSC, her journey into the world of film making was guided by a diverse array of films that left an indelible mark on her approach to cinematography. Lavelle's eclectic taste in cinema is evident in her choice of favorite films, which she describes as a "pretty weird mix. " Her list includes Wiseman's groundbreaking documentary Titicut Follies,

Baz Luhrmann's visually extravagant adaptation of Romeo and Juliet and Michael Cimino's epic drama The Deer Hunter.
