Therefore, the IMAGO Working Conditions Committee and the IMAGO Committee of Diversity and Inclusion ask you for your commitment:

Together with FORBA Working Life Research Centre, Vienna we have elaborated a survey to assess and quantify working conditions of directors of photography and their crew across Europe and internationally. In many IMAGO member countries, working conditions are seriously deteriorating, 14-15hr days is more the rule than the exception, and the problem is increasing in many places. We think it is IMAGO's responsibility to contribute to stopping this negative trend!
