Ahmet Sesigurgil, GYD, from Ankara, is a distinguished Turkish cinematographer who took his first steps in the world of imagery through black-and-white photography in a newspaper darkroom.

His passion for visual storytelling eventually led him to New York, working in the independent film scene, gaining hands-on experience and honing his skills.

After 16 years in the U.S., Sesigurgil returned to Turkey, where he is now a prominent figure in the Turkish film industry, bringing his extensive international experience to a wide range of projects.



In the coming months, Ahmet Sesigurgil is set to work on the highly anticipated Netflix adaptation of Orhan Pamuk's Museum of Innocence, one of the most ambitious projects in Turkish cinema.

Alongside this large-scale production, he will also collaborate with acclaimed director Emin Alper on an independent film.

These projects reflect Sesigurgil's continued prominence and influence in both mainstream and independent Turkish cinema.

Emir Kusturica's Underground sparked his desire to make movies from a young age, serving as a personal inspiration.

## TERRE DI CINEMA - August 31st - September 15th



The 2024 CineCampus at Terre di Cinema continues its mission to teach the art of shooting on film to a new generation of global filmmakers.

Founded in 2011 by Vincenzo Condorelli, AIC, under the guidance of Luciano Tovoli AIC, ASC, the event focuses on preserving film culture and technical mastery.


Supported by key partners like Kodak Motion Picture Film, Cooke Optics, Panalight, ARRI, De Sisti Lighting, Nanlite, Nanlux, and Augustus Color Lab, CineCampus 2024 features 40 students producing 14 short films in Siracusa.

The program includes masterclasses from renowned professionals and fosters a global exchange of ideas with participants from over 20 countries.

This year, AIC enhances CineCampus with masterclasses from Daniele Massaccesi and Luciano Tovoli, overseen by Vincenzo Condorelli. BVK will be represented by Johannes Kirchlechner as Cinematography Tutor, Martin Bethge as Camera Operators Tutor, and Mitch Boxrucher, who will focus on s16mm film. Additionally, Fabio Policastro, a highly experienced Gaffer, will offer his expertise in lighting and on-set practices.

The festival's core mission is not just to teach the technical aspects of shooting on film both 16mm and 35mm, but to instill in participants the rich cultural heritage and disciplined approach that is essential to this art form.

The Manaki Brothers Film Festival, the world's oldest festival dedicated to cinematography, will celebrate its 45th edition in Bitola, North Macedonia, from September 21 to 27, 2024.

Organised by the Macedonian Film Professionals' Association (MFPA) in collaboration with the Cinematheque of Macedonia, Bitola Cultural Centre, and the city of Bitola, the festival has grown into an international event featuring the prestigious Camera 300 awards.

It also celebrates cinematographic masters through its CLUB OF GREATS and Special Golden Camera 300 awards.

The 45th anniversary edition will feature a curated selection of films, exclusive premieres and retrospectives.





In a time where we often connect through devices, this meeting aims to encourage in-person knowledge exchange.




The event focuses on four pillars:
