


Narvydas is a Lithuanian cinematographer who began his career in an unorthodox way. Coming from a family of regular workers and driven by intuition, he discovered photography and filmmaking during his studies at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre. Initially aspiring to become a director, he embraced cinematography when the opportunity arose and has since developed a reputation for flexibility, collaboration, and a keen eye for detail. His work spans short films, music videos, and feature films, often characterized by a mix of documentary-style realism and bold artistic choices.



Narvydas is preparing to shoot a feature film in March. This upcoming drama explores themes of personal and societal conflict during the early days of the Ukraine war. With a strong focus on naturalistic visuals and emotional resonance, the project embodies Narvydas's belief in adapting style to serve the story.

Narvydas credits his artistic development to his openness to learning from others. He values collaboration with directors and musicians, finding inspiration in their unique perspectives and the shared effort to bring stories to life. When asked about his influences, Narvydas mentions films like Post Tenebras Lux by Carlos Reygadas, Haskell Wexler film Medium Cool, Apocalypse Now, and The Conversation by Francis Ford Coppola, which helped shape his cinematic language.

# FILM RELEASES

## FATEH - Vincenzo Condorelli, AIC



The movie had its world premiere in Dubai on January 8 at the Reel Cinema, Dubai Mall, at 7.30. The India premiere will be held the next day at PVR Juhu Beach in Mumbai. From January 10th Fateh was distributed in over a thousand theaters throughout the Indian Federation. The movie will be streamed exclusively on Disney+.

"It's incredibly exciting to think about the millions of fans eagerly awaiting the release of this film. The first trailer garnered 32 million views in just a couple of weeks. Even after several years, Bollywood's numbers continue to amaze me. I believe that Fateh, within its genre, is a film that will meet expectations, delivering two hours of breathtaking action and intense emotions. From a visual perspective, I am extremely satisfied with what we have achieved, thanks primarily to the outstanding work of my camera team.

The cinematography of Fateh embraces a bold, low-key aesthetic, with an emphasis on hard light to amplify the film's intense and gritty tone. This approach enhances the dramatic tension of the action sequences, creating stark contrasts and sharp shadows that reflect the high stakes and raw emotions of the story. My goal was crafting visuals capable of evoking a sense of realism and urgency while maintaining a striking, stylized edge that complements Fateh's adrenalinic narrative flow."
