# YUNUS EMRE HAMIS GYD


His visual mastery is deeply tied to Turkey's rich landscapes and cultural diversity, which continue to inspire his storytelling.

Known primarily for his work in documentaries, he has also achieved notable success in commercial and digital media projects.


For Yunus, cinematography is more than just a profession, it's a visual bridge to understanding



## IBC 2025 - September 12 to 15 - RAI Amsterdam



Starting today, the 56th edition of the International Broadcasting Convention (IBC) opens its doors at RAI Amsterdam.

This year, over 1,350 exhibitors from around the world are showcasing the latest in production, post-production, broadcasting, virtual production, and content delivery.

Among them are 17 companies particularly relevant to cinematographers, offering new technologies and solutions across camera systems, optics, colour, grip, and image control.

Across three days, from September 12 to 14, a series of ticketed conferences will take place, culminating in the presentation of the IBC 2025 Innovation Awards on the 14th.

The awards cover five categories: Content Creation, Content Distribution, Content Everywhere, Environment and Sustainability, and Social Impact.

IMAGO will be represented by it's General Secretary Alex Linden, FSF and it's Sponsorship Coordinator, Roger Simonsz, BSC.

# WHAT'S GOING ON

## MANAKI BROTHERS - September 20 to 26 - Bitola

The Manaki Brothers Film Festival, the world's oldest festival dedicated to cinematography, will celebrate its 46th edition in Bitola, North Macedonia, from September 20 to 26, 2025.



### Darius Khondji and Wally Pfister Honoured at the 46th Manaki Brothers Festival



At a press conference held on September 9th, festival director Dimitrija Doksevski announced two major awards for outstanding contributions to the art of cinematography.

Darius Khondji ASC, AFC will receive the Golden Camera 300 for Lifetime Achievement, honouring his influential career in modern cinema. Known for his visually striking work on films like Se7en, Evita, Amour, Uncut Gems, Okja, and Bardo, Khondji has collaborated with renowned directors such as David Fincher, Bernardo Bertolucci, Michael Haneke, and Bong Joon-ho. With two Oscar nominations, he is widely regarded as one of the leading cinematographers of his generation.

Wally Pfister ASC will receive the Special Camera 300, recognising his outstanding contribution to global cinema. An Oscar-winner for Inception (2010) and longtime collaborator of Christopher Nolan, his credits include Memento, The Dark Knight trilogy, Moneyball, and The Italian Job. Starting in television news, Pfister rose to prominence through both indie and studio films, becoming one of Hollywood's most respected cinematographers.





The official festival poster, created by renowned artist Kiro Urdin, was also unveiled at the press conference, along with the film selections for the main competition, shorts, documentaries, and student programs.

The lineup was curated by Sladjan Penev, Marija Apchevska, Atanas Velkovski, Kumjana Novakova, and Hanis Bagashov.

### **IMAGO PANEL**

IMAGO will host a panel on September 25th from 10:30 AM to 12:00 PM to present the AFC Blind Standard format film lens test.

As the name suggests, the Blind Test is conducted without revealing the identity of the lenses during the screening. Participants are invited to compare a selection of lenses, evaluating a range of visual characteristics including overall impression, contrast, sharpness, focus transition, colour saturation, reflections, bokeh, and coverage.

Each viewer records their impressions on a questionnaire, assessing the lenses solely based on what they see on screen, free from any brand influence or technical bias. Only at the end of the screening are the lens identities revealed, allowing participants to compare their notes with the actual models used.

## **BALKAN CONFERENCE**

The 14th traditional IMAGO Balkan conference will be held on the 23rd of September during at the Manaki Brothers International Film Festival.

Established by former IMAGO president Nigel Walters BSC, the conference brings together cinematographers from Balkan countries to discuss regional and international topics.

This year's topic will be dedicated to working conditions in the Balkans, following up last year's drafted Manaki Manifesto.

The IMAGO Working Conditions Committee and the D&I Committee will present the first draft of the extensive European survey conducted earlier this year.

The second part of the conference will focus on AI, with Dr. Cristina Busch presenting AI and the Future of Filmmaking - Exploring AI's Impact on Creativity, Ownership and Fair Remuneration.

The conference is organized by the Manaki Brothers Film Festival and IMAGO, supported by national Balkan societies.



Best cinematography for a first or second feature film


The awards ceremony will take place on a special evening on February 3, 2026.

# N MEMORIAM: Eduardo Serra, AFC, ASC (1943-2025)



IMAGO mourns the passing of Eduardo Serra, ASC, AFC (1943–2024). Twice nominated for an Academy Award and honored with the ASC International Award, he brought light and depth to films such as The Wings of the Dove, Girl with a Pearl Earring and Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows. Eduardo was also among the key figures in IMAGO's foundation and the second cinematographer to serve as president of the AFC. Remembered for his integrity and generosity, he will be deeply missed by colleagues and friends around the world.

### EDUARDO SERRA, THE LOSS OF A FRIEND AND A GREAT ARTIST.

Eduardo Serra came to Cinecittà, together with his colleague Jacques Loiseleux, as a representative of the AFC, on that cold morning of 13 December 1992 for the second decisive meeting that would lead to the official establishment of the European Federation IMAGO on the same day. I knew Loiseleux because he had been my talented camera operator in Paris on a film by Maurice Pialat, but I had never met Eduardo, whose talent as a cinematographer I had long admired. Later, I had the opportunity to meet him several times in Paris and appreciated his deeply human side, together with his extremely refined general culture and his technical expertise linked to the great tradition of photography. A few years later, his sublime work in "Girl with a Pearl Earring" revealed him to the world and allowed him to fully express and showcase his profound creativity. For me, and I believe for all of us, Eduardo will always be remembered as part of that group that came to Cinecittà thirty-two years ago with heads full of innovative ideas and worked to make those ideas a reality.

The Quick Release has been updated! Since the original quick release was launched, some users experienced problems with easily getting it on and of the ball stud on the camera. This new design allows it to be more easily attached and detached from the ball stud, and it's now a sleeker and more intuitive design. We have decided not to increase the cost of the quick release due to this change.

### Art.No: B160 – Battery Plate for boom poles




